North West London Jewish Day School aims to:

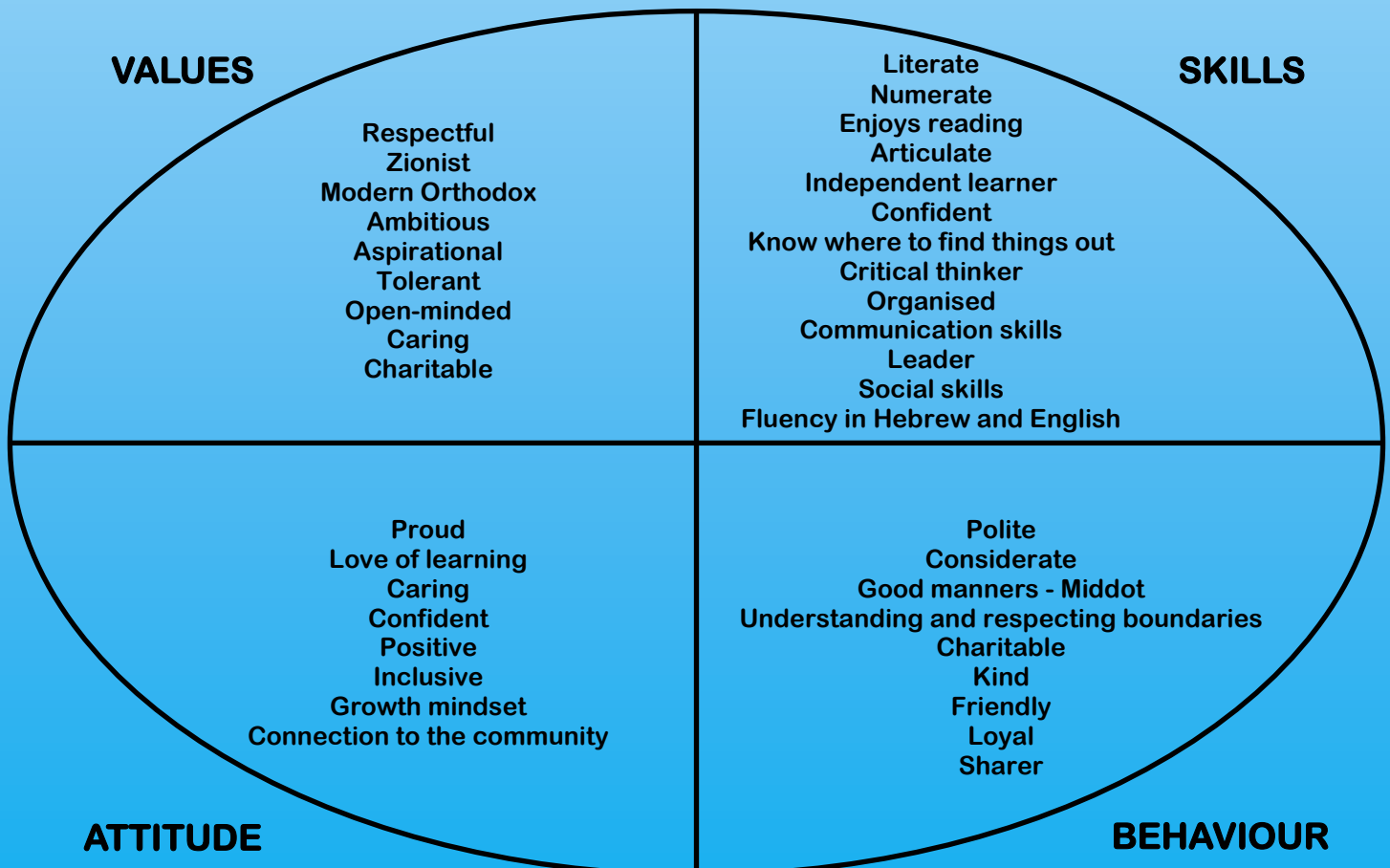
- Continually strive for excellence ;**

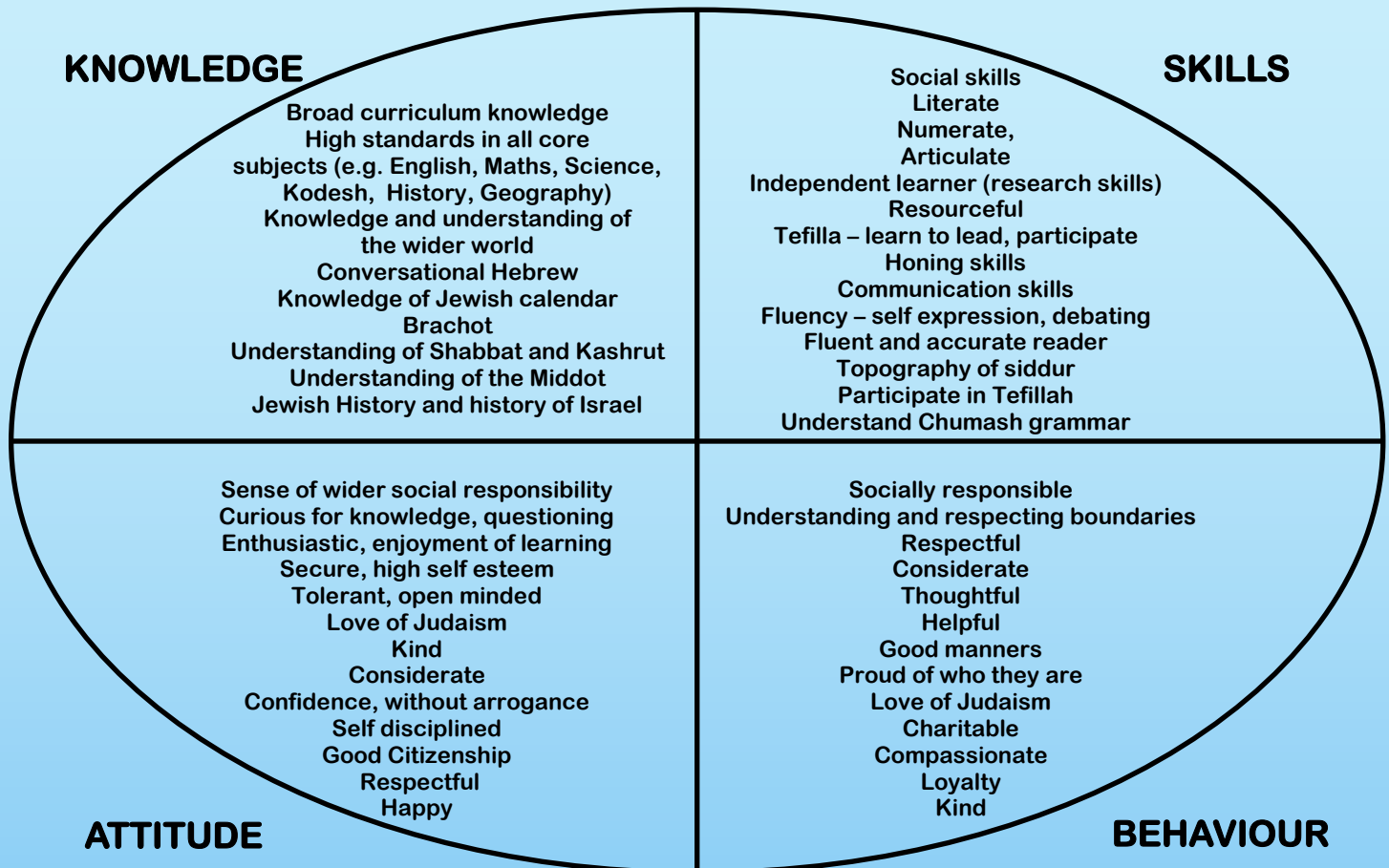


What do we want our graduates to look like, when they leave North West at the end of Year Six?

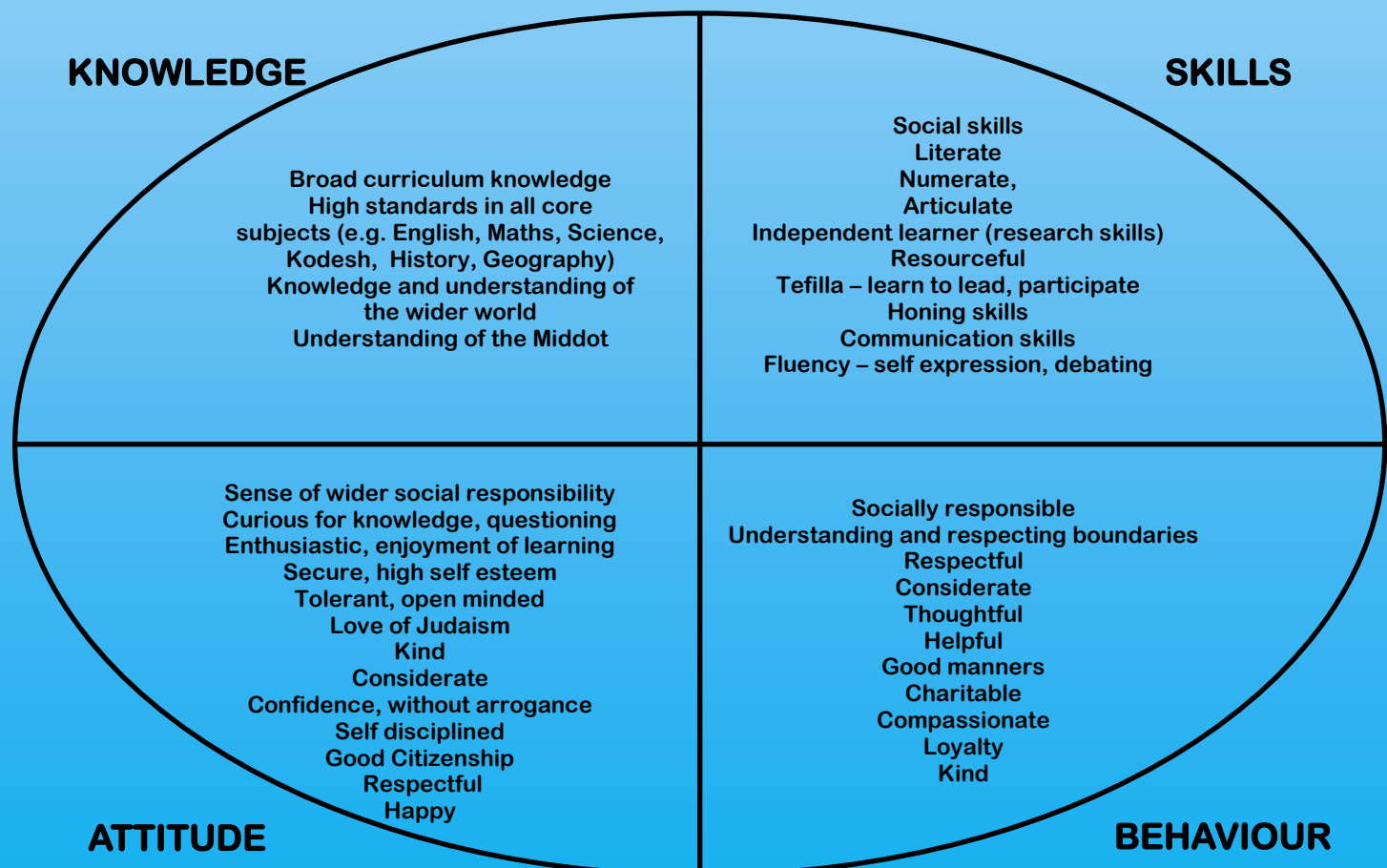


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Teaching & Learning, and Assessment will enhance these areas:
